This course of study aims to support and improve the girls' reading skills, their analysis of language and extend their vocabulary; all key skills for their GCSEs in English Language and English Literature, which begin next year.

We have also designed our curriculum to reflect what it means to be a young, British woman today; for our pupils to know about the struggle and sacrifice that has led to the freedom and opportunity we have. We want them to know about their heritage and culture, and that of others in our community, enabling them to celebrate and contribute to the progress of democracy as global citizens. For your information, some of our novels explore exactly these themes. 'The Black Flamingo' (by Dean Atta) is the inspirational tale, from child to adulthood, of a young man struggling with his identity and sexuality along with his acceptance and eventually, his celebration of himself. Additionally, Angie Thomas' ground breaking novel, 'THUG' explores the experiences of young black women and men in modern day America.

Indeed, all our novels explore the resilience needed in order to seek truth and justice; all celebrate the absolute core principles of democracy and consider the human condition ('Watch us Rise', 'The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas'). Finally, we inspire our pupils to delight in the words of American Youth Poet Laureate Amanda Gorman: 'We seek harm to no one and harmony for all.'
