

### Half Term Two in the Careers Department

This half term has been a brilliant one in the careers department; with activities for most of our year groups, including trips, mentoring, visitors and careers meetings.



### **Careers meetings**:

Careers meetings have still been going ahead, with Years 11 and 13, carried out by IntoUniversity, Miss Everard and Sharon, our Futures advisor. Great themes have been reached in this, with students in Year 13 choosing vocational routes or applying to a host of universities, and our Year 11s really starting to reach for some amazing destinations, such as Architecture, Retail Apprenticeships and Animal Handler. The lunchtime careers drop in has showcased the phenomenal level of proactivity from our students, who choose to come see us at lunchtime to discuss their ambitions (particularly since the roll out of the Work Experience programme!).



### Trip to the PwC Offices in Castle Donington:

Year 10 have been doing work with some PricewaterhouseCoopers this term, which all started with a workshop around SMART goals - setting goals that are Sensible, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic and Time specific. This is a transferrable skill that will greatly benefit Year 10 as they move towards their GCSE year and their career thereafter. Forty of our pupils then volunteered to participate in a trip to the PwC offices in Castle Donington. Whilst there, they heard from current employees about their job roles and career journeys, and worked in groups to a project brief in one of PwC's actual boardrooms! Ten fantastic presentations were given in the afternoon, centred around solving issues in online learning and eco-friendly clothes sharing.

### Year 9 BEE Like Me event

At the end of November Year 9 pupils had the chance to participate in our BEE Like Me Event. The day started with 3 workshops around self-confidence, managing money, and pathways to careers (led by Capital One). In this we found that our Year 9s had a variety of ambitions, such as Choreographer, Mental Health Therapist and Accountant. They also got to ask Capital One questions, a lot of which centred around coding, pay rates and even company policy on climate change! Later in the day, the pupils were able to hear from successful women in different fields, many of which are traditionally male dominated. Pupils spoke to each visitor in groups, and were even able to try out equipment from the fire and police services. Many of our visitors were alumni, and were once in our pupils' shoes!

Moving into the home stretch of half term two, and looking forward to half term three, we're excited about the events we have approaching. These include National Apprenticeship Week, National Careers Week, Year 8 Careers Day, our Futures Fair on 14 December and the selection process for the Year 10 DHL Trip to Aberdovey in Wales.






## Ada Lovelace Virtual Trip - Tuesday 12 October




