Progress and Attainment

You may recall from a previous letter that we were thrilled with the performance of our Year 11 pupils and A-Level students last year.

Final, validated results are yet to be published by the government, but early indications are that we are well on course for record results, including for:

- The proportion of pupils who achieved a grade 5 or higher in both English and Maths.
- The proportion of pupils who achieved a grade 7 or higher in both English and Maths.
- The proportion of pupils who achieved a grade 5 or higher in every element of the English Baccalaureate (English, Maths, Science, History or Geography, and a Modern Foreign Language).
- The overall progress made by pupils.
- The average point score per entry at A Level.

I will update you when these are published early next half term.

Behaviour

As you are aware, we introduced a new behaviour policy this term, which we have called The NGA Way.

We know that achieving exceptional standards of behaviour and conduct leads to exceptional academic performance and progress for all of our pupils. High standards particularly support those from disadvantaged backgrounds. Our ethos is to do this in a way that reinforces positive behaviour and allows children to demonstrate they can learn from their mistakes.

This half term, teachers have awarded a phenomenal 32,251 BUILD points (and still counting) to pupils who have demonstrated the NGA Way or shown they are working to BUILD their Future, BUILD their Relationships or BUILD our Community.

I am also very grateful to you for your support in ensuring your children attend any same-day, afterschool detentions they are set. This has allowed us to quickly hold restorative conversations, underline expectations and reset for a fresh start the following day.

As a result of all of this we have seen a significant reduction in the number of incidents of disruption in lessons, a huge improvement in the amount of homework being completed on time, and the vast majority of our pupils meeting our high expectations on a daily basis. This can only further support the progress and achievement of your children.

However, despite this overwhelming success, there are still some pockets of misconduct that we would like your help in eliminating.

Pupils are awarded misconduct points for issues such as poor uniform, lateness to lessons, chewing gum or eating in classrooms or corridors. This are all things that are very much within a pupil's control - they choose whether to meet our expectation or not. These are not trivial rules that we ask pupils to follow. They each play an important part in establishing the safe, clean, high quality and high performing environment I know you want your children to be educated in. I would therefore ask that you continue to reinforce our expectations and standards at home and support us in the event that we need to issue escalating sanctions for repeated failure to meet the required standard.

I hope that you all have a relaxing and enjoyable half term and look forward to seeing you all in 2 weeks.
